


Pentastar COVID-19 CARES Edition

While Pentastar has been designated as critical infrastructure in the transportation industry, the drop in volume at the FBO and in our flight operations has allowed us to direct some of our resources from time to time on projects that we have coordinated to help others in this unprecedented crisis.

At the outset of the crisis, we had several employees, including Joe Hedges and Kim Massa, craft facecoverings for use at our PTK facility. With the help of Carmen McKenna, we have now designed and begun to producing sewn fabric masks using a variety of donated and purchased materials, including a wire nose bridge for comfortable breathing.

We have produced hundreds of these face coverings and will be sharing some of these with the **Waterford Urgent Care** center, **VC Value Market** grocery store, and others in our community.

Another project we have undertaken is the production of plastic face shields for health care workers. We made a nominal investment in two 3D printers and Patric Bernardo from our ITM department volunteered to assemble them. We sent our first batch of 8 to the **Waterford Urgent Care** of April 23rd and will deliver more to a couple of hospital systems next week.
